



Organization Description:

The Clothes Closet, located on the first floor of the Mead House near the corner of 8th and Telfair Streets, is a long-standing ministry for people in need of clothing. The Clothes Closet offers all types and sizes of clothing for men and women year round. Pricing is flexible: some items are priced individually; others are available for inclusion in \$2 and \$5 "all you can fill bags." Those who are homeless or have no money may choose 2 outfits, along with underwear, socks, and Blessing Bags with items such as soap, shampoo, toothpaste, toothbrushes, and wash cloths.

Types of jobs for volunteers:

There are four options; all involve sitting, standing, and walking:

- Staff workers on a regular basis for the Clothes Closet.
- Back-up workers in the Clothes Closet to cover vacations & appointments.
- Fundraising through parking cars in the St. John lot to earn cash for purchase of Blessing Bag items, underwear, socks, and gloves.
- Behind-the-scenes workers sorting and hanging

Hours volunteers needed:

- 10:30 AM to 1:30 PM on every Tuesday of the month
- Hours vary for parking cars and sorting clothes.

Organization Description:

DCCM Food Pantry is a multi-denominational coalition of 15 area churches that have combined resources to run a centrally located food pantry in the heart of downtown Augusta in the Mead House at 430 8th St. Since 1978, DCCM has established itself as a consistent, reliable source of food for those in need. DCCM is a joint effort of local churches (primarily downtown churches) that operates a food pantry out of the first floor of the St. John Mead House. St. John was one of the founders 40 years ago. DCCM is categorized as a super pantry, distributing nearly 100 tons of food to clients every year. This food is purchased from the Golden Harvest Food Bank.

Organization Description:

Heritage Academy provides a culture of learning with high expectations for academic character and spiritual development. Its goals include providing educational opportunities for underserved children from low-income families in the Augusta area. Heritage Academy accepted its first class of 10 students in 2001 and now has 240 students in grades kindergarten through 8th grade and a preschool program. It provides a dyslexia identification and limited treatment program, a rigorous academic program, art and music education, a maker space program, sports, and weekly chapel. Students have consistently outperformed both national and county averages on standardized tests and gone on to success at high school and college levels.

Organization Description:

The Hale House is halfway house for men challenged with substance abuse. The Hale House Foundation Inc. is a 501c3 non-profit which operates this transitional program assisting men over the age of 18 suffering from substance abuse problems to recover in a safe homelike setting until they are ready to assume responsibility for their own lives. The one year program gives them the tools necessary to readjust to society and to resume independent living. Despite the ideal length of stay of one year, the Hale House offers programs without this restriction to accommodate individual needs. It holds to a strict zero tolerance policy for alcohol or drug use as well as any unwillingness to cooperate with foundation rules.

Valor Station, operated by the Hale House Foundation, is a residential treatment facility for "first responders" (law enforcement officers, firefighters, EMT's and dispatchers) suffering from PTSD, depression, anxiety, addiction and other problems associated with the unique stresses associated with their professions.
